1.	AAMAR KHODJA Aomar	ALG	4 atopy schools created in 2018-2019
2.	AOKI Valeria	BR	The Sao Paulo support group is very dynamic on the internet and Instagram. They include art in their educational approach especially with teenagers who appreciate this artistic approach. Big advantage on a psychological point of view.
3.	BELLONI Anna	IT	They organize TPE sessions separately for children and adults with the help of a dedicated nurse.
4.	BLESSMAN - WEBER Magda	BR	They have asked themselves why it is so difficult to convey patient to TPE sessions. So they have decided to invite an external speaker to give a 15 min talk during the TPE session, then they start the discussion.
5.	De RAEVE Linda	BE	They organize TPE sessions separately for French speaking patients and Dutch speaking patients. They don't propose too many sessions otherwise patients don't attend all of them. They face difficulties for the patients to come to attend sessions during the day (working hours).
6.	DELEURAN Mette	DEN	A facebook (FB) page has been created by a young nurse at the hospital for the patients to be informed about the TPE sessions. It is very successful for the recruitment. A lot of demands comes from the FB, no need to be a patient from the hospital, all patients are accepted even if not followed by doctors from the hospital. They propose Children eczema schools + Teenagers. Teenagers enjoy creative activities.

7.	EICHENFIELD Lawrence	USA	Training allergy with nurses Creation of education tools They use an audio powerpoint to explain AD management to patients 15 pediatricians have been trained and are now "mini-experts": they use education tools Need to train primary care who is poorly trained They teach how to calculate the quantity of treatment to be used at the beginning of the ttt. Industry send 25 people to the center to show what TPE is: very beneficial.
8.	EL HACHEM Maya	IT	Patients have the possibility to book their eczema class through the website of the hospital. The registration fee is 20 euros/class. They have stopped collective session for individual sessions only. A psychologist and a game assistant (anti itching games) are involved in the class. They provide a bag to each patient (family) containing: Books, information brochure and antiscratching distraction technics. They organize 1 Openday every year open to all patients and HCP: testimonies, open discussions and other activities (sports).
9.	GELMETTI Carlo	IT	TPE is not a waste of time but gain of time
1.	LUNA Paula Carolina	ARG	TPE is not structured in Argentina, there is a recent patients association for 2 years. Open group: 3 meetings every 3 months on Saturdays: one to one meeting. Very rewarding but evaluation is needed.

11.	MARCOUX Daniele	CAN	7 dermatologists involved in the atopy school. Close work with Amanda Crosswell from the patients' association. They have created a program called "Optimum care in Eczema" and have written a list of FAQ coming from the patients, Caroline Jacques a new dermatologist answers the patients' questions. Project: to make a video for eczema like the one made by Abbvie about psoriasis with a little teddy bear.
12.	MISERY Laurent	FR	Long term experience in TPE. Main concern: lack of time of doctors and nurses.
13.	MOSCA Ana	BR	No nurse. TPE is conducted by dermatologists, allergologists and psychologist. They have started yoga sessions against itching and gym sessions for the children + a therapeutic garden close to the hospital (= TPE outside the walls)
14.	MURASHKIN Nikolay	RU	Works in a pediatrician institute. They receive groups of parents. Project to develop a mobile app for the management of AD to collect patients big data.
15.	ORTIZ-BRUGES Ariana	ESP	18 teams of TPE in Spain. They conduct an evaluation study using the PASECI and the TOPICOP that are completed immediately after TPE, then 1 month and 3 months after the last TPE sessions.
16.	RAMIEN Michele	CAN	They have developed the Eczema Action Plan, and now they conduct a study to assess the interest of using the action plan. The action plan follows the patient all along his patient's journey: from atopy school to Pharmacy and to family doctors, so that every HCP is aware of the personalized TTT and AD management of the patient.

17.	SUE John	AUSTR	Practice in a dermatological clinic and a general clinic. Nurses organize late workshops with 5 to 6 patients with an education nurse. They also organize group sessions of 20 people. TPE is organized every 2 months in the evening during the week, with a nutritionist and a psychologist. Difficulty: to find the right psychologist who can manage and understand the psychological impact of skin disease. They work with the Australian support group who has a facebook page and a website (John is not very familiar with that).
18.	VESTERGAARD Christian	DEN	Same as Mette DELEURAN.
19.	WOLLENBERG Andreas	GER	Difficulty in acceptance of the full German TPE program for patient / family who are very busy or single person: 12H training, from 6.00 to 8.00pm. Test run for a compact model of TPE: a lighter educational program of only 4H TPE. A study comparing the people who receive the 4H TPE versus no TPE at all will be conducted to demonstrate the benefit of a compact TPE program. The protocol has just been approved by the Ethics Committee. The results of the study are expected by Q2 2020.
